

## Colorectal cancer screening

2018

**Measure description:** Percent of adult members (ages 50-75) who had appropriate screening for colorectal cancer.

**Purpose:** Colorectal cancer is Oregon’s second leading cause of cancer deaths. With appropriate screening, abnormal growths in the colon can be found and removed before they turn into cancer. Colorectal cancer screening saves lives while also keeping overall health care costs down.

### Measure Specifications

**Data:** Claims and Medical records (Chart review)

**Benchmark:** 54.0%

**Denominator:** OHA provides the CCO with a sampling frame of members age 51 – 75 as of December 31, 2018. Members must be continuously enrolled for all of 2017 and 2018 with no more than one gap of up to 45 days during each year.

**Exclusions:** Members with a record of colorectal cancer or total colectomy are excluded. Medicare members 65 years and older who live long-term in an institution during 2018 are excluded.

**Numerator:** Members in the denominator with documentation in the medical record indicating they received at least one of the following screenings:

**Medical Record Review:** Documentation in the medical record must include a note indicating the date when the colorectal cancer screening was performed. A result is not required if the documentation is clearly part of the “medical history” section of the record; if this is not clear, the result or finding must also be present.
