1.0 Call to Order	Dori Statton called the meeting to order at 12:03 pm.			
2.0 Council Business	<p>The June 21, 2018 minutes were reviewed. Connie Atwood moved to approve the June 21, 2018 minutes. Dori Statton seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.</p> <p>Laura Williams made the announcement as a reminder (from the last month's meeting) that Dr. Muday has resigned from Advanced Health and we are in need of more CAC members- both consumers and non-consumers. It was confirmed by Sharon Daymond that Mariah Bennett will be unable to continue on the CAC due to her work schedule.</p> <p>CAC membership drive is needed (Connie Atwood suggested notifications in the newspaper, Alice Taylor suggested that Bonnie Ell go to visit the receptionists at area provider offices to provide them with CAC information to distribute, especially to disgruntled patients who want to help make positive change).</p>			
3.0 CHA-CHIP Process	<p>Laura Williams mentioned that we are currently working on a collaborate Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP). A joint meeting was held on 6-22-18 with multiple community partners in hopes to work on a collaborative plan led by a contracted facilitator, Vanessa Becker, to move forward with a joint CHIP in order to leverage resources and identify shared goals for Curry County where we're not duplicating efforts.</p> <p>Laura Williams mentioned the work the CHIP</p>			



	<p>Communication, Transportation and Benefits group did to delve into the Advanced Health website in an effort to identify what information the website had readily available and what may have been missing or what could have been formatted differently to make</p> <p>Connie Atwood noted that we need more colorful posters and flyers that 'pop' and stand out for recruitment efforts, etc.</p>		
<p>4.0 Curry Public Library</p>	<p>Jeremy Skinner provided an update and slideshow for us regarding the current work of the Curry County Library. The library was built in 2008 but public meeting space has been limited or unavailable in the past, but now with the renovations will offer multiple new meeting spaces, including a large room for up to 150 people, shared kitchen space and restrooms, as well as high speed Internet.</p> <p>On August 18, 2018 the renovated a library will have its grand opening and spaces will be made available to the community- free for non-profits and a fee for other businesses. The Curry County Public Library recently was awarded a \$1.1 million grant for a middle school after school program including transportation, snacks and a full-time director.</p> <p>Sharon Daymond asked if the Library would be offering computer skills training (specifically for older people). Jeremy confirmed that they will be offering a number of training and education but they need help in getting people to attend.</p>

<p>6.0 Advanced Health updates</p>	<p>Maggie Lowery provided the following update:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Curry Advanced Health supported Curry General Hospital’s outpatient PT with funds to buy ten units. - Curry Advanced Health supported Oasis Shelter with funds for paint for their shelter rooms. - The announcement was made that we are looking for a new office space in Brookings as CCH needs the office space that Maggie had been using. - Curry Advanced Health is continuing with monthly case management meetings and Maggie is working with tobacco cessation classes. <p>Laura Williams mentioned that we are currently planning our 2018 Coos-Curry CAC Retreat, which will be hosted in Gold Beach and is tentatively scheduled for October 10th. The Retreat would be facilitated by Vanessa Becker and would entail work related to our new collaborate CHIP and will include real ‘retreat’ sort of activities (beach walk, fun activities, etc).</p> <p>Laura mentioned that 960 people have received ACE training in Coos & Curry Counties!</p>		



	<p>Connie Atwood asked how the current ACE trainings are being used in the community. It was mentioned that standing meetings at DHS as well as multiple school districts, CASA volunteers, and foster parents have taken place. We also have upcoming film nights being scheduled to show the film 'Resilience' and eventually 'Paper Tigers' will be shown in both Coos & Curry Counties.</p> <p>Jeremy Skinner mentioned that there will be various ways for us to partner with the Library in our work related to the ACEs and other community programs, Parent Cafés, etc.</p>		
<p>7.0 Curry Community Health</p>	<p>Beth Beasley provided updates regarding upcoming youth events that Curry Community Health will be hosting. These events include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Art in the Park - Family Camp (Strengthening Families), Facilitated by Curry Community Health <p>CCH will also be piloting a yoga class for three months, beginning on July 26, 2018 for patients who are experiencing chronic pain. The instructor will be Christine Good from Brookings Harbor Physical Therapy, who is a trauma-informed yoga instructor.</p> <p>CCH will also be hosting a Mental Health First Aid class on July 27, 2018 at the Pacific Reef Hotel, which will be free to the public.</p>		
<p>Other updates</p>	<p>Gordon Clay noted his work with suicide prevention and his current work regarding underage drinking and his project called 'A River of Booze-South Fork'. For more information, visit: www.TheCitizensWhoCare.org.</p> <p>Gordon also shared an email regarding a disturbing email he had received from a friend who shared information of a friend who was in crisis and reached out to all of the major medical centers in Brookings and Gold Beach and was turned away not having received any mental health services. Gordon believes it should be required</p> <p>Gordon also distributed a flyer with information on the current Parent Cafés for 2018 in Gasquet, Crescent City, Klamath, and Smith River.</p>
