4.0 Update from OHA	Public meetings went very well. A survey link will be available soon for English and Spanish versions. The innovator agent position opened on 10/19.				
5.0 Updates from WOA	Maggie: facilitated small grants for Bright Eyes and the Aunt Flo Project. Tobacco cessation classes 10/19-11/9 every Wednesday from 1:30-3: changing the class style to a rotating start so people can start on any week. Living well classes will begin in January. Jessie: getting certification as Community Health Worker Laura: role at WOA is changing- now the director of community engagement and gets to focus 100% on community projects. CAC retreat Nov 10 from				



	10-3:30 at gold beach resort conference room- with Coos CAC- focus on social determinates of health. Opiate summit coming up at the Mill Casino in Coos Bay. November CAC meeting will be cancelled because of bridges of poverty workshop.			
6.0 CHIP Updates	School base- still working on a nurse for gbhs. Transportation- addressing informing members that they have a benefit and how to use it. Communication- development of a resource guide; very rough draft with some feedback. Have a partnership with OASIS they were happy to turn the project over to the CHIP committee. Mental health- started PAC, meets every other week; have developed a mission statement and are working on by-laws Healthy lifestyles- have grant money to go to food banks in January to support the after holiday slow season Prenatal care- focus on one key question :“do you want to get pregnant in the next year?” grant support from WOAHA for bright eyes to pilot this program- allows them to address several issues by asking one question.			
7.0 SBHC Presentation	Previously had a 2 day event at brookings school based health center that was very successful (60 kids in 2 days); second #TBH event in gold beach at CCH on 10/25-26. Scheduled appointment for wellcare visit, dental screening with fluoride, sports physical and they receive a swag bag and amazon gift card. They partnered with the school to provide a shuttle service. This is available through a grant from WOAHA.			
8.0 SCRELHub Presentation	Skydra is the home visiting coordinator. SCREL is the South Coast Regional Early Learning Hub, they do not directly provide services but help with the coordination of services available to people in need. The SCREL hubs are a state initiative to help make sure every child is ready for kindergarten. Their goal is to help create healthy and stable families while increasing the coordination and collaboration of services. They also provide grants for innovative projects that drive change. Bright Eyes is a current recipient for their grant and they are working on a “centering pregnancy” model to provide group classes for expecting and new parents to come together and meet services providers and learn from them and each other. Past examples have supported preschools in myrtle point and powers.
