| 3.0 Oregon Health Authority (OHA) Updates | <p>Belle Shepherd reviewed her monthly report from OHA with the CAC:</p> <p>REPORTS and NEWS:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Transformation in Action newsletter: behavioral health project stories. The recently released newsletter includes stories from three CCOs (Columbia Pacific, Trillium, Eastern Oregon) about work they're doing to support members' behavioral health. The strategies highlighted include: Medicated-assisted treatment (MAT); Street outreach connecting to services and housing; Social and emotional development during the first five years. The Health Evidence Review Commission (HERC) posted the final version of its Multisector Intervention Report: Community Health Workers (CHWs) for Patients with Chronic Disease, as approved by the commission on 11/14/19. This 28-page report discusses evidence that supports that CHWs serving as part of an integrated care team appear to improve outcomes, and where there is limited evidence to support improved outcomes using CHWs. The document highlights CAC changes included in the new CCO contracts starting January 1, 2020. The changes pertain to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • CAC Membership – We must have a Selection Committee who is responsible for selecting members of the CAC by March 31, 2020; • New Definition of Consumer Representative – for the first time OHA has issued a definition of a “consumer”, which is a person serving on a CAC who is on (or was within the previous 6 months) the Oregon Health Plan. Consumers must be at least 16 years of age. A parent, guardian, or primary caregiver of an individual who is on (or was within the previous 6 months) the OHP can also be considered a consumer representative. • Requirements for Tribal participation on CACs • CAC Member representation on the CCO Governing Board • Annual CAC Demographic Report • CAC Duties: CCO Spending Decisions • Health-Related Services • Social Determinants of Health and Equity (SDOH-E) • Supporting Health for All through Reinvestment (SHARE) initiative | | |

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| | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There was a good turnout at the monthly meeting at the hospital where Gregg Gill, Addictions Supervisor at Curry Community Health, said they now have a therapist in Port Orford to provide outpatient treatment. • Maggie Lowery supplied handouts and Advantage Dental bags to pregnant mothers at Bright Eye’s Midwifery. • Advanced Health helped a homeless member get lodging in Medford for a surgery they needed. • Advanced Health distributed easy-to-use Interpreter Service flyers and let providers know that we now have two certified Spanish-speaking interpreters in our office who, with prior notice, can meet members at the clinic for their appointment to ensure the members are understanding the provider as well as go over their medications with them. <p>Laura Williams announced that the next Curry Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) meeting is scheduled for February 5, 2020, at the Curry Public Library, from 2 pm to 4 pm. CHIP workgroups are forming, please join one if you haven’t yet.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Connie Atwood stated that the Food & Nutrition Workgroup is meeting tomorrow for their first meeting, at the Brookings Harbor Food Bank, from 4 pm to 5:15 pm. • Connie Hunter announced that the Access Workgroup is looking for OHP members to join. Sherri Estelle indicated she was interested in joining. • Dori Statton asked for a schedule of when all the workgroups meet (which will be developed once each workgroup has chosen a regular schedule). <p>Laura Williams stated that it is still Advanced Health’s intent to schedule a full day of training (or 2 half days) for CAC members on the community grant funding decision making process. 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| | <p>community partners to explain our new process for applying for community grants.</p> <p>Lisa Castle, Quality Improvement Specialist, introduced herself and gave an overview of the Quality Program’s focus for this year.</p> | | |
| <p>4.0 Consumer Credit Counseling</p> | <p>Consumer Credit Counseling of Southern Oregon Presentation – <i>Improving the financial health of individuals, families, and communities</i>. Bill Ihle, Executive Director and Chief Executive Officer (CEO), provided an overview of the services that they provide, which includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Counseling & Debt Management • Education and Outreach • Money Management Program <p>The majority of their clients come from low and moderate income households. Their outcomes have been very good: 57% of clients are now on a personal budget, 37% have paid down their debt, 32% reported that their credit has improved, and 13% have purchased a car.</p> <p>Bill indicated that they would like to expand their video conferencing abilities into Curry County once funding would allow them to do so. This would allow Curry County residents to access a financial counselor locally via video conference rather than having to drive to Medford. Discussion was had among the CAC members of how credit counseling fits in with our goals of the community health improvement plan.</p> | | |
| <p>6.0 Community Partner Updates</p> | <p>Gordon Clay, Zeroattempts.org– Suicide prevention training for Veterans will be held at The Mill Casino Hotel on February 6, 2020. The Suicide Council seated 15 people (21 people applied). Their first meeting is February 5, 2020, 5:00 pm, and it is open to the public.</p> <p>Mellanie Caldera with Oasis Advocacy – Mellanie introduced Ashley who is new to Oasis and will be representing their programs.</p> <p>Michelle Hannah, Coast Community Health Center (CCHC) – Michelle is now managing the Social Determinant of Health</p> | | |



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| | <p>(SDOH) program and CCHC. She is also running the Healthy Families Oregon program. CCHC is looking for an Eligibility Screener in Coos and Curry counties. OHSU contacted CCHC about bringing a Vision Van into Bandon. The plan is to expand into Northern Curry. The Port Orford Pharmacy is now open.</p> <p>Elaine Lortscher – Announced fundraiser for ARC, which is made up of case managers and parents that serve people with intellectual and developmental disabilities.</p> <p>Dori Statton – Announced the upcoming Curry Community Health Behavioral Health Advisory Board meeting.</p> <p>Mendy Hayne, Brookings Church of the Nazarene – Mendy said this is their “launching season”. They are launching their Belonging, Believing, Becoming program. Youth Ministry meets on Wednesday evenings at 6 pm. The Church has partnered with the Brookings Harbor Food Bank and will help collect food for the food project. They also have a support group for moms of young children, meets 1st and 3rd Mondays of each month, 9:15 am to 11: 15 am.</p> | | |
