1.0 Call to Order	Bonnie Ell called the meeting to order at 12:00 pm.		
2.0 Council Business	Beth asked if everyone had the opportunity to review the minutes and if there were any edits or comments. There were none and the April 28, 2022 minutes were approved.		
3.0 Oregon Health Plan update	A Healthier Oregon presentation was given by Bevin Ankrom (see pdf attachment for full details) - Extended coverage for pregnant women - CCO Enrollment Timeline - July 5 th will begin auto-enrollment for the Healthy Kids program - Outreach and Communications (community presentations, awareness flyers, social media updates etc) - Letter to CWM Members (mailing was sent out to members in 35 different languages and outreach calls were made to notify of benefits and enrollment to a CCO) -Mendy Hayne asked about the timeline on the Redetermination process. Bevin said are on hold until 60 days following the public health emergency (possibly until October or December)		
3.0 Advanced Health updates	- Bonnie Ell noted a correction on the agenda and that it is the Community Health Improvement Plan progress report that will be reviewed at the June 23 rd Curry CAC meeting (and not the Community Health Assessment- CHA), although she did announce that the both CCOs are gearing up and are close to finalizing a contract with a consultant who will work on developing the new CHA for 2022-2023. -Bonnie also reminded the CAC that the Curry CHIP Coalition meets 1 st Wed/month, 2-4 pm: https://allcarehealth.zoom.us/j/98554749338?pwd=cWhpQWRhR1owT1JuYjRGTlp2cXQxQT09 -Bonnie announced that she will be transitioning from Advanced Health on June 16 th to work for the Oregon Department of Human Services Child Welfare Department, serving as the Resource (Foster) Parent Recruitment and Retention Champion for D7 (Coos and Curry). 4.0 Wally's House	Jackie Antunes from Wally's House joined us to share about the great work being done as the child abuse and prevention center for Curry: - Forensic interviews - Multi-Disciplinary Teams (MDT) - Mandatory reporting training services - Mental Health services (in the works as Wally's House is in the process of hiring a mental health professional to work in-house) - In home safety service provider services to help prevent children from entering the foster system - Flexible funding to support families - Tangible need donations accepted - Board members are needed for 2-year terms, although they can reapply for an additional 2 years upon approval from the Board.
